Best Practice Inclusion Strategies Rick Clemens, M.A. (Founder and Director of IECP, Inclusive Education and Community Partnership) This session will discuss the inclusion strategies that make kids and teachers successful. We will cover a brief look at curriculum adaptation, social and play skills, and behavior supports. Participants will leave with an understanding of some of the key components necessary to help kids succeed in inclusive classrooms.	Practical Social Skills Solutions Peter Gero, Ph.D., MFT (Founder and Director of BLAST) Social skills are the foundation of getting along with others. A lack of social skills can lead to behavioral difficulties in school, bullying, difficulty in making friends, aggressiveness, etc. Children with disabilities often need additional training in social skills. They will likely benefit from direct instruction in social skills groups led by trained professionals and the availability of a safe environment in which to practice newly learned skills. Dr. Gero will offer teachers and parents practical solutions when dealing with behaviors at home and in the classroom.	Setting Students Up for Success Roberta J. Goldberg, Ph.D. & Andrea Lombardi, B.A. (The Frostig Center, Pasadena, CA) The results of the Frostig 20-year Longitudinal Study which identified individual characteristics and life experiences that lead children growing up with learning disabilities to successful life outcomes will be discussed. These Success Attributes are Self-Awareness, Use of Support Systems, Goal Setting, Perseverance, Emotional Coping Strategies, and Pro-activity. Attend this presentation to learn about the Success Attributes and how to foster their development to prepare your child for success!	Autism Speaks Programs and Tools Phillip Hain (Executive Director, Autism Speaks, Los Angeles Chapter) Phillip Hain, the father of a teenager who has Aspergers Syndrome, will be talking about the mission of Autism Speaks, its 100 Day Kit, some of the research the organization has funded, its advocacy work, and resources available to help families of children on the autism spectrum.	"But he's not crazy!" – Making Informed Decisions About Medication Brett Sevilla, M.D. (Medical Director, Asian Pacific Counseling & Treatment Centers; UCLA Department of Psychiatry & Biobehavioral Sciences) Mental illness and psychiatric medications are highly stigmatized in our society. Misinformation and opinionated advice make parents' decisions about psychiatric medication difficult and stressful. Parents need access to reliable, scientifically-based information about the benefits and risk of medication in order to make informed decisions.
